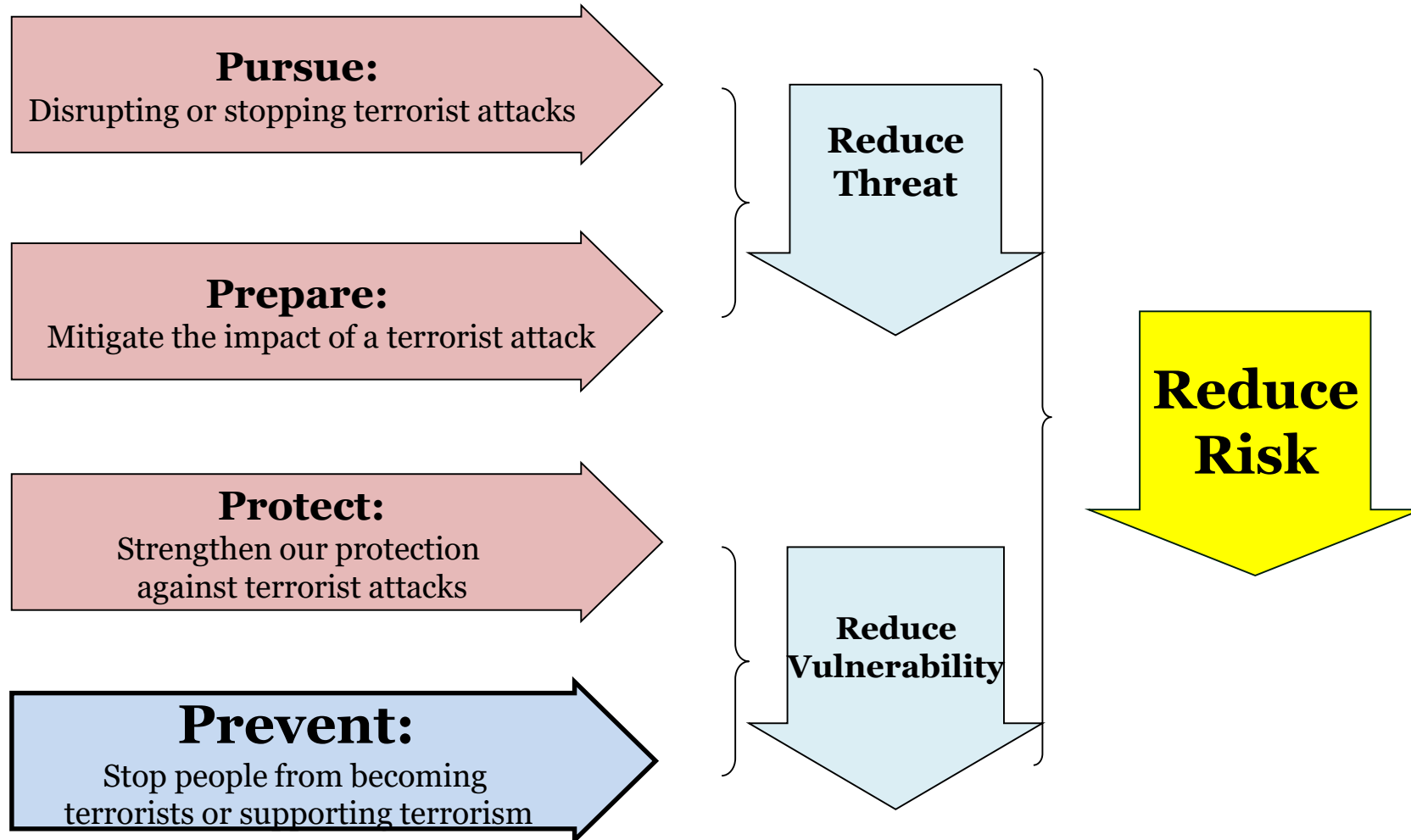

# What is Prevent?

- To stop people becoming terrorists or supporting terrorism
- Building community resilience to challenge extremist and terrorist ideology
- It is about all forms of terrorism, Far Right and Islamist Extremism
- Prevent operates in the non-criminal space
- ***Prevent is about SAFEGUARDING***

# Funded Training and Building Resilience to Extremism through Enquiry Support

The Mayor of London Shared Endeavour Fund is sponsoring a program to use Philosophy for Children (P4C) to build understanding and critical thinking about extremism and terrorism for year 5 and 6 teachers and students.

There is a familiarization session at Manorfield Primary School on Monday September 21 at 13:00 to see how your school can get involved.

## Participating schools will receive, free of charge:

- Facilitation training for current P4C or new-to-P4C teachers
- In-school support
- A package of 14 fully-resourced lesson plans
- Collaboration opportunities and a celebration event in Spring 2021

## Benefits for schools include:

- A DfE endorsed approach to meet the Prevent duty and OFSTED safeguarding requirements;
- Giving teachers the resources, pedagogy, skills and confidence to develop pupils critical thinking;
- Skills in facilitating enquiry and dialogue which will enhance teaching across the curriculum.
